The Barn project was launched in response to the need for affordable, centrally located office space that supports Portland's mission-driven organizations in a new way.

The building is being designed to accommodate the unique needs of nonprofits, and will serve as a progressive model for engagement and community building. Unlike a traditional office building, the Barn's net revenue will be reinvested to support shared services and building programs. Prospective tenants have the opportunity to participate in the design and programming process.
