David Douglas slams sloppy Central Catholic

Jordan Perry threw six touchdown passes as Central Catholic took advantage of four David Douglas turnovers on the way to beating the Scots 49-21 in a Mt. Hood Conference football game Thursday night at PGE Park.

Perry threw three touchdown passes in each half, including two to Bryson Koch during a 21-point second quarter when the Rams took control of the game. Central Catholic (3-2, 2-1 Mt. Hood) and the Scots (2-3, 2-1) are among five teams tied for first place in the conference.

Perry completed 11 of 17 passes for 134 yards with no interceptions.

David Douglas' ball control during the first half — the Scots ran 39 plays to 18 for the Rams — wasn't enough to overcome the Scots' turnovers. David Douglas had the equivalent of four turnovers before halftime, with two fumbles, an interception and a bad snap recovered by the punter deep in Scots territory.

The game wasn't one-sided from the outset. David Douglas made the score 7-7 midway during the second quarter when tight end Owa Odighizuwa scored on a 37-yard touchdown pass from Tyler Maes. Less than two minutes later, Perry threw a 26-yard pass to Koch, who caught the tipped ball while lying on his back in the end zone, to regain the lead for the Rams at 14-7.

Starting with Koch's circus scoring catch, the Rams scored 21 points during the final 5:08 of the second quarter. The second touchdown came on a 60-yard interception return by Nick O'Donnell.

No. 5 Canby 33, Newberg 27:

The Cougars, in their third consecutive game decided by seven points or fewer, scored two fourth-quarter touchdowns and got a big interception to edge the visiting Tigers in the Pacific Conference opener for both teams.

Josh Yoder accounted for three touchdowns, including a decisive 50-yard pass to Cody Smith to put the Cougars ahead 26-21 with two minutes, 33 seconds remaining. The Cougars (4-1) then intercepted a Newberg pass, and Rodi Samoilov ran in for his second touchdown to cement the win. Matt Dufour completed 18 of 27 passes for two touchdowns for Newberg (3-2).

No. 7 Grant 54, Wilson 14: The Generals led 35-0 in the first half and cruised to the Class 6A Portland Interscholastic League victory over the Trojans at Lincoln High School in Southwest Portland.

Grant quarterback Kenneth Acker passed for three touchdowns and scored touchdowns on a 70-yard punt return and a 91-yard kickoff return

After Wilson (0-5, 0-1 PIL) scored on a nine-yard pass from Robbie Wilson to Ben Overlund, Acker returned the ensuing kickoff for a touchdown that put the Generals (5-1, 1-0) ahead 41-6.

Sandy 35, Reynolds 33: The Pioneers (4-2, 1-2 Mt. Hood) stopped a two-point conversion attempt by the Raiders (0-6, 0-3) in overtime at Mt. Hood Community College in Gresham and collected their first conference win since 2006.
